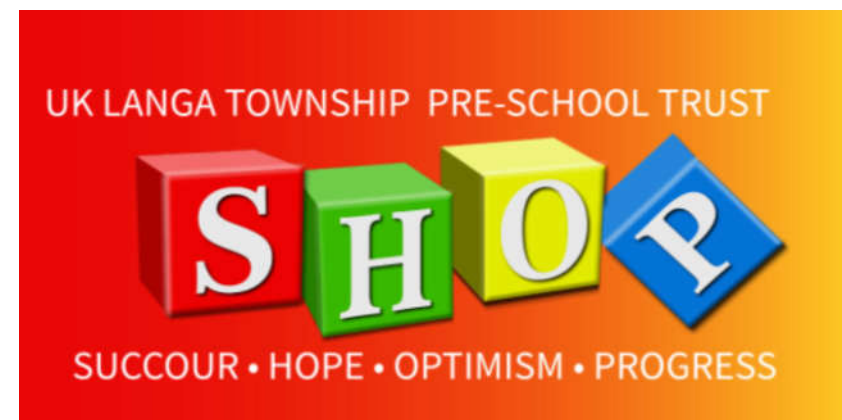
He has been working closely over the last two years with the chairman of LTPT, Gordon Gaddes, on developments for pre-schooling in Langa Township.

DOYLE LEGACY

The LTPT team in Cape Town have fulfilled the LTPT commitment to the Doyle Legacy trustees to spend in the financial year 2024/25 ££8,350 in support of the Dalukhanyo pre-School. In addition to the spend on flooring, roofing and the gutters and downpipes in the main building, the other 40% of the donation has been spent on tracksuits, educational toys and play equipment, paint and materials for the children and equipment and furniture for the kitchen and office, and groceries.



Message from Gordon Gaddes, Chairman and Founder Trustee 2011

LTPT newsletter readers will recall the launch of the SHOP project three years ago. The Trustees were trying to support more pre-schools in Langa Township, but through its Nomonde Educare project, to give the Langa Early Child Development Forum a building as a basis for reaching out more widely. As explained on page 4 of Newsletter 49 this has not worked. Do we give up? No! We have gone back to our roots and the conclusion in 2011 described on page 1 of the LTPT Newsletter Issue 1, quoting, 'the first priority is to buy food for the children, many of whom receive their most nutritious food regularly at School. This action will take some pressure off the budget and enable staff to be paid somewhat more regularly'.

Move on, in the context of the terms of reference of LTPT being to support pre-schools in Langa Township, the LTPT Trustees have decided to focus fund raising for the next two years, at least, on supporting a new SHOP project 'Food for Kids' and shortly a dedicated fund raiser will be launched. In the meant time our supporters, present and future, can be assured that 98% of available funds raised through voluntary work goes to Langa and also that we in our small way in global terms are not going to succumb like some governments, to reducing our contribution, we intend to increase it to the best of our ability.
